

MINUTES OF THE WORK SESSION
OF THE CADDO PARISH COMMISSION
HELD ON THE 4th DAY OF OCTOBER, 2021

The Caddo Parish Commission met in a Work Session, on the above date, at 3:30 p.m., in the Government Chambers, with Mr. Johnson, presiding, and the following members in attendance constituting a quorum: Commissioners Atkins, Burrell, Cawthorne, Chavez, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, Taliaferro, and Young (1). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1).

Mr. Young gave the invocation, and Mr. Lazarus led the Commission in the Pledge of Allegiance.

AGENDA ADDITIONS

It was **moved by Mr. Chavez** to expand the agenda and add *Special Resolution of Appreciation & Recognition for the 2021 Winners of The Prize Fest Film Prize and Special Resolution Celebrating 100 Years of Boy Scout Troop 15* under New Business on the agenda.

At this time, Mr. Johnson opened the floor for anyone to speak in favor or against adding these items to the agenda. There being no one to speak in favor or against these resolutions, Mr. Johnson closed the public hearing.

At this time, Mr. Chavez's motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioner Atkins, Burrell, Cawthorne, Chavez, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, Taliaferro, and Young (11). NAYS: None (0). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1). ABSTAIN: None (0).

CITIZENS COMMENTS

Robert Tyler came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

When I see white men on horseback corralling black people, it seems unseemly and reminiscent of a disturbing part of American history. Yet, there are elected officials like Ed Lazarus and Todd Hopkins who sees that and says "That a boy!". So, let me educate you. Although if you're a Caucasian member, I doubt you'd care. In 1915 Woodrow Wilson sent the Marines to Haiti to Germany business relations. Again, I say business relations he had might reduce American commercial and political manipulation inside of Haiti. Previously, Andrew Johnson tried to annex Haiti although unsuccessfully. By 1915, Americans were afraid that the debt Haiti had to pay to France as punishment for being the first to avail against slavery tied them too closely to their former crop colonizers. So first when America moved on Haiti they moved the financial reserves to America and took it upon ourselves to rewrite their constitution to give foreigners land on their rights. The reason government in central American called banana republic because we literally did a coup to get cheaper prices on bananas. During this corruption, I mean during this occupation, 15,000 Haitians were killed. And although US pulled troops out in 1934 the United States exerted control over Haiti's finances until 1947. The US even provided aid to the French colonists to stop the rebellion when they fought for their freedom. More recently, we invaded Haiti. In 1994 with Bill Clinton. We returned again in 2004 with George Bush. And each time the Haitians were worse off than before we touched their soil. So fast forward, the Haitian president was just assassinated by those reportedly with US ties. They experienced a devastating earthquake. Their country is in shambles and riddled with violence, so scared and desperate that they travel miles-men, women and children-to experience the illusion of America that is propagated throughout the world. Just to realize that they wont be afforded the opportunity to legally apply for asylum. Just to realize as in 1619, and as in 1877 and as in 1954, whether they be Democrat or Republic, America is still spelled with three k's. It's the heartbreak of African descendants everywhere in this nation.

VISITORS

- Shreveport Fire Department

Clarence Reece, Administrative Assistant to the Fire Chief, came before the Commission and thanked the Commission for considering ballistic vests for the Shreveport Fire Department and Caddo Fire Districts. He also explained that they provide ballistic vests for each seat on a firetruck. They ordered three firetrucks in the past few months, which will provide twelve vests; and they have three more on order, which will provide twelve more vests. He also said that they have six ambulances coming, which will provide an additional twelve vests. Mr. Reece said that they do not have enough vests for every member, nor do they have enough money in the Budget for every member.

Mr. Reece also explained that they've been called to scenes recently where they've been the target. He also said that the Shreveport Fire Department or anyone in EMS enters a scene unless deemed safe by law enforcement.

Mr. Chavez thanked Mr. Reece and the Shreveport Fire Department for all of their hard work in making this community better. Mrs. Gage-Watts agreed and also Commended Mr. Reece and the Shreveport Fire Department.

Mr. Taliaferro said that the vests will be assigned for each unit, not each individual. Mr.

Reece agreed and said that it is assigned to that seat on the truck. He also said that the option for the firefights or EMS personnel to buy individual vests in an option, but they have to be Level 3A. Mr. Taliaferro explained that this level of protection will shield the EMS and firefighters from box cutters, knives, and certain calibers of guns.

Mr. Johnson wanted to know if SFD conducted test runs with the vests, along with their bunker gear. Mr. Reece said that Chief Wolverton came up with the Fire Safety Committee, who consists of law enforcement, fire investigators, military personnel, etc. The ballistics vests are exterior vests and easy to take out. He also said that they tested several vests. Mr. Reece said that they are not using it with bunker gear, unless absolutely deemed necessary.

Mr. Johnson would like to have Caddo Parish's logo on the vests.

Mr. Epperson wanted to know if the City of Shreveport has contributed to this project, and how much. Mr. Reece said that they are providing three new trucks and twelve vests, but he does not know the dollar amount.

Mr. Johnson wanted to know how the fire trucks relate to the EMS runs. Mr. Reece said that a fire truck and an ambulance or a ladder truck and an ambulance roll out to every single fire and EMS run. Deputy Chief Eugene Sweet said that a medic truck and supervisor vehicle responds to all EMS calls.

Mr. Johnson requested a breakdown of all the vests being requested by the City and the Fire Districts.

NEW BUSINESS

It was **moved by Mr. Hopkins**, seconded by Mr. Atkins, *that Ordinance No. 6096, an ordinance declaring certain adjudicated properties to be surplus and to authorize the Parish Administrator, or a designee, to sell the Parish of Caddo's tax interest in certain surplus adjudicated properties, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for introduction. Motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Atkins, Burrell, Cawthorne, Chavez, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, Taliaferro, and Young (11). NAYS: None (0). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1). ABSTAIN: None (0).

It was **moved by Mr. Taliaferro**, seconded by Mrs. Gage-Watts, *that Ordinance No. 6109 of 2021, an ordinance amending the Budget of Estimated Revenues & Expenditures for the Riverboat Fund for the year 2021 to provide an appropriation of \$165,300 to provide ballistic vests for Shreveport and Caddo Parish Fire Districts, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for introduction.

Mr. Taliaferro said that this is a worthwhile investment to help protect the EMS and firefighters who are protecting the citizens of this Parish.

Substitute motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mrs. Gage-Watts, *to provide an appropriation up to \$165,300 for the ballistic vests and to place the Caddo Parish logo on the vests.* Motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Atkins, Burrell, Cawthorne, Chavez, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, Taliaferro, and Young (10). NAYS: Commissioner Epperson (1). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1). ABSTAIN: None (0).

It was **moved by Mr. Epperson**, seconded by Mr. Taliaferro, *that Ordinance No. 6111 of 2021, an ordinance to amend and reenact Article II of Chapter 19 of the Code of Ordinances relative to Housing & Economic Development, to provide additional requirements for applicants, and to otherwise provide with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for introduction.

Mr. Atkins asked for additional clarification regarding this ordinance. Attorney Bernstein explained that the City Office of Community Development asked that a letter of support be provided, instead of a letter of approval. He also added that the other amendment is in regards to property standards. Mr. Jackson requested that if someone is requesting land to be donated to them that they have no current property standards violations.

consideration. Motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Atkins, Burrell, Cawthorne, Chavez, Epperson, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, Taliaferro, and Young (11). NAYS: None (0). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1). ABSTAIN: None (0).

It was **moved by Mr. Burrell**, seconded by Mr. Chavez, *that Resolution No. 67 of 2021, a resolution establishing a Community-Based Broadband Committee of the Caddo Parish Commission to make recommendations for increasing broadband access in Caddo Parish, and otherwise providing with respect thereto* be moved to Thursday's agenda for consideration.

Mr. Burrell said that this committee will address broadband issues in the Parish.

Mr. Johnson mentioned that other parishes and counties have private companies also participating in their expansion of broadband.

It was **moved by Mr. Hopkins**, seconded by Mr. Lazarus, *that Resolution No. 71 of 2021, a resolution in support of resuming federal offshore leasing in the Gulf of Mexico* be moved to Thursday's agenda for consideration.

Mr. Hopkins said that he received word from former Lt. Governor Scott Angelle requested a resolution of support from each of the parishes.

Mr. Cawthorne wanted to know if the federal government put a moratorium on federal leasing of contracts in the Gulf of Mexico. Mr. Hopkins agreed. Mr. Cawthorne said that the Biden Administration put the moratorium on the leases due to the concerns with the environment.

He also wanted to know how this resolution of support would directly impact North Louisiana. Mr. Hopkins explained that it would allow offshore drilling, which would then bring money back to Louisiana.

Mr. Epperson said that this is a federal situation and feels that this is out of our purview. He also said that there are leaks in Gulf of Mexico which they cannot find. He also suggested that we bring wind farms to Louisiana as a source of energy.

Mr. Young said that this resolution is not connected with Caddo Parish business.

Mr. Burrell wanted to know if the Governor of Louisiana agrees with this resolution. Mr. Hopkins said that there are suggestions that Governor Edwards and other coastal governors have filed suit. Mr. Burrell asked that Administration find out if the Governor is in favor of this resolution.

Mr. Atkins agreed with Mr. Hopkins and said that the Governor is asking for some relief in regards to the moratorium. He also said that Louisiana benefits greatly when there is offshore drilling.

Mr. Taliaferro agrees with "staying in our own lane and deal with things that have to deal with Caddo", but will be voting yes on this resolution because the oil and gas industry impacts Caddo Parish.

Mrs. Gage-Watts mentioned that a judge has ruled resumption of federal offshore drilling in June. She said that this resolution is in agreement with what the judge has already ruled.

Mr. Johnson said that this does impact Caddo, Bossier, and Webster. He said that there is an oil refinery that runs in North Louisiana and affects everyone in Caddo Parish.

Mr. Cawthorne wanted to know if this resolution will be routed to Louisiana's federal delegation. Mr. Hopkins said that it will.

At this time, Mr. Hopkins' motion carried, as shown by the following roll call votes: AYES: Commissioners Atkins, Burrell, Chavez, Gage-Watts, Hopkins, Johnson, Lazarus, and Taliaferro (8). NAYS: Commissioners Cawthorne, Epperson, and Young (3). ABSENT: Commissioner Jackson (1). ABSTAIN: None (0).

It was **moved by Mr. Epperson**, seconded by Mr. Hopkins, *that the appointments of Steven Jackson and Ryan Williams to the Juvenile Justice Citizens' Advisory Committee* be moved to Thursday's agenda for consideration.

Amendment by Mr. Hopkins, seconded by Mr. Lazarus, *to replace Steven Jackson with Heather Courtney for District 3.*

Mrs. Gage-Watts explained that the Citizens' Advisory Committee was established to hear the voice of the citizens. She said that she was going to make a motion to remove Mr. Jackson from consideration due to that reason, as well as a perception of a conflict of interest.

Mr. Burrell wanted to know if there is a conflict of interest with a Commissioner serving on

the Citizens' Advisory Committee. Mr. Johnson said that he is a citizen, but he is also an elected official.

Mr. Cawthorne said that technically Mr. Jackson is a citizen of this city, parish, state, and country. He said that Mr. Jackson is not here today to explain nominating himself to sit on this committee. He also said that Mr. Jackson has a great skillset and encouraged him to find someone in his district to be on this board.

Mr. Epperson stated that anything the committee recommends has to come before the full body. He also said that it is Mr. Jackson's right as well as any of the Commissioners' rights to attend the meetings. Mrs. Gage-Watts agreed.

ADMINISTRATOR REPORT

- Emergency Rental Assistance Program Update

Mrs. Barnett said that there are over 8,500 applications. The program has helped over 5,000 families and distributed over \$16M in rent. Today, they received an additional allocation of \$4.1M from Treasury. Last week, an agreement with the State was signed for a re-allocation of \$6.5M. By end of year, over \$25M will have been distributed for ERAP funds.

Mrs. Barnett also said that she received noticed today from Treasury that any

counties/parishes who have not issued at least 65% of ERAP funds will have to submit a Performance Improvement Plan to Treasury. If that does not happen, those funds have to be returned. Those returned funds will be reallocated to other counties/parishes who have been successful in distribution of the funds. She also mentioned that Caddo Parish has distributed 100% of ERAP1 funding, so Caddo Parish has more than surpassed expectation from the U.S. Treasury with regards to ERAP.

Dr. Wilson explained that the \$25M has a tremendous impact in our local economy.

Mr. Johnson asked if there was a waiting list. Mrs. Barnett said that there is not currently a waiting list. She also encouraged all the citizens in need to apply.

Mr. Burrell asked for more clarification on the program. Mrs. Barnett explained that the program only allows for fifteen months of rent.

- Juvenile Detention Center

Dr. Wilson said that there are eighteen children in detention; three of which are 17 year olds. There are currently eleven juveniles at CCC.

- Best Friends Society

Dr. Wilson said that Caddo Animal Services Assistant Director, Kelvin Samuels, completed the Best Friends Society National Executive Leadership Program this year. He also mentioned that this was a free grant tuition that he received.

- Administration Response to Commissioners

Mr. Young asked for an update on the RFP for the relocation of the Confederate Monument. Dr. Wilson said that there is no expiration for the RFP, but since it is a capital project, the Commission has three years to complete it. He also said that they received estimates for the work to be completed, and is expecting to have that work done next year. Mr. Young wanted to know if the funding is included in the Budget. Dr. Wilson said that it is.

Mr. Burrell asked for an update regarding coyote issues at the old Shreveport Golf Course. Dr. Wilson said that he received a letter from the property owners, who are repairing the fence and fixing the down trees around the property. Once it is completed, they will send Dr. Wilson another letter informing him of the completion of the work. Mr. Burrell wanted to know if they are still trapping the coyotes. Mr. Samuels said that they are still trapping the coyotes.

COMMUNIQUES/COMMITTEE REPORTS

- Mr. Cawthorne said that the Economic Development Committee met last week. He said that the Committee discussed Project Quatro who will be providing 632 jobs with annual average salary of \$50,000, an investment of \$1B over a twelve year period, and the request from the company is \$3.8M. The Committee voted unanimously to support the \$3.8M and recommend it to the full body.

The Committee also discussed the proposed Amazon TIF. A recommendation was made to direct Administration to convene a meeting with the City, School Board, David Wolfe, and the Caddo Commission to discuss the TIF.

- Mrs. Gage-Watts said that the Juvenile Justice Committee will meet this week. She asked that the Committee members provide her with a time in which they will be available on Thursday.

She also announced that there will be a National Night Out event tomorrow beginning at 6:00 p.m. at the Winnfield Funeral Home parking lot. She invited all to attend.

- Mr. Chavez said that tomorrow is National Night Out. He encouraged all to attend the events. He also announced that it is Hispanic Heritage Month, and LSUS will host a drive-in movie highlighting this month. He encouraged all to attend.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Mr. Johnson reminded the Commissioners that tomorrow is National Night Out. He said the events will kickoff at 6:00 p.m.

He also said that the Commission is doing everything they can to keep the public safe and healthy. Mr. Cawthorne mentioned that there has been a downward trend in COVID cases, but are still concerned with North Louisiana because its low vaccination rate.

CITIZENS COMMENTS (Late Arrivals)

Marvin Muhammed came before the Commission and gave the following comment:

I'm going to be very succinct. I'm going to use the meat of my comments at the primary meeting on Thursday, because I want you all to digest the weight of my words then. But I did want to come and speak. I believe it is Ordinance 6103 on the North Caddo Economic Development District that is on the agenda. Historically, when different corporations have come to Caddo Parish- the General Electric, General Motors, Libbey Glass. They come. They receive a pallet, usually from the IDB or the board on which you gentleman and lady so graciously appointed me to. Historically, what we fail to do is when we have an introduction and an urgency of these corporations to our Parish we have failed to create an ecosystem around those entities. And so after the tax rebatements, after the tifs, after whatever the corporations are to receive when their supposed to go back on the tax rolls they then decide to leave. And because we haven't built up an ecosystem around that area. It leaves a gap. This tif speaks directly to that. It allows us an opportunity to build up North Shreveport, North Caddo Parish. At the intersection of Hwy 1 and Highway 538, and for those who are numerically challenged like myself, that is MLK and North Market at the Brookshires. There, in that strip mall if you will, occupancy rate is about 50%. When you go south on North Market which the tif district would include, when you go up to Hearne, literally every 20 or 40 yards you see literally blight. You see vacant businesses. So, what we do know is that the State of Louisiana allows us to set a baseline but three methods. Either by taking the last year tax revenue or the last two of the last three. So, it is very critical that we establish that baseline, because as we know there was a dip in revenue while we were struggling from COVID. What is very important, because I have seen a lot of writings on Facebook and some of the local periodicals or publication that talked about the pilot that Amazon received through the IDB. I can assure you that that pallet will not be jeopardized. That lease agreement will not be jeopardized. This is something that will simply aid us. In conclusion, crime. I travelled on Youree Drive just last week. And I had four stops. One minute, Mr. President, and I'll conclude. In an hour, I'll be trying to get some dinner, Mr. President. I was out on Youree Drive and I had four stops. One at Lowe's. One at Vision for Less. One at Regions. And one at Men's Warehouse. And I was literally able to perfectly complete those tasks in under an hour. WE cannot do that. Those citizens in North Shreveport Caddo Parish cannot do that on North Market or Hwy 1. This tif allows us to be able to grow that area and more importantly starts retail leakage over and beyond 220. We talking about 500 employees the first year that would then scale up to 1000 the second year. Well, that's a lot of lunch. We want those dollars right here in Caddo Parish. I appreciate you and look forward to your vote this Thursday.


